We just finished our week of Holiday Bible Club at Congleton Baptist Church. It was an exciting week. We had 81 different children attend during the week. Our high day was on Wednesday when we had 65 young people there. During the week 16 children prayed to receive Christ as their Savior. It was an intense week, a powerful week, and a week of fun memories. On Thursday, the building we were renting had been double-booked so we had to set up tents outside for our activities. Not only did it rain that day, it poured. Everyone was soaked.
